

Born in Avellino, 29 March 1964, he obtained his degree in Architecture with honors in 1989 from the University of Naples "Federico II", after performing experiments to study at Columbia University in New York. Qualified as an architect in 1989, he enrolled in 1990 the Order of Architects of the Province of Avellino. Since 2007 he entered the Order of Architects of Caserta.

In 1994 he obtained his doctoral degree in Conservation of Architectural Research at the Department of History and Restoration of Architecture University of Naples "Federico II".

In 1994-95 was a postdoctoral fellow at the Institute of Cybernetics of the CNR.

In February 2000 she served as assistant professor in the scientific field ICAR19 - Restoration at the Faculty of Architecture of the Second University of Naples.

Winner of the competition for second level teachers launched in March 1999 by the University of Florence, in January 2001 he served as associate professor in the field ICAR19 - Restoration at the Faculty of Architecture of the Second University of Naples. It is confirmed in the role in 2004.

The Department of Architecture and Environmental Restoration and Construction, member of the board of the department from June 2003 to date, since January 2007, deputy director of the department.

Since 2005 he is member of the University Commission for Libraries. Since 2006 he is member of the Scientific Council of the RIAS (Interdepartmental Centre for the control of the built environment) and since 2008 he is Head of the Laboratory "Diagnostics for Restoration" of the same center.

He organized and directed research groups. She coordinated a national scientific initiatives. He has organized national and international seminars. He was a member of the Scientific Committee of national conferences and exhibitions.

He was visiting professor at Italian and European universities.

He is a member of learned societies, scientific committees of national journals, reviewer for international journals and co-editor of book series.
