ADDITIONAL INFORMATION (Profile and Current Research Interests)

Since the early years of her research, she has carried out topographic studies aimed at reconstructing ancient roads in Campania and Southern Lazio and the organization of the territories connected to them, using traditional and innovative methods typical of the topographical discipline.

The results of the research conducted in these years have been merged into papers received in national and international scientific books and magazines and in popular publications. She has been interested in the development and application of non-invasive archaeological investigation methods such as archaeological photointerpretation, finalized photogrammetry and mapping, remote sensing, applying them to topographical themes following the most recent methodological developments of the discipline in the digital field of remote sensing.

Her interest in technical analysis through the graphic documentation of archaeological data aimed at analyzing the remains is based on an in-depth knowledge of direct and indirect excavation documentation techniques and monuments, extended to the aerial and terrestrial photogrammetric techniques of buildings complexes, residential settlements, cities, entire territorial sectors; has refined these skills by attending advanced training courses, laboratories and national organizations of cartographic production at the forefront in the field of aeronautical photogrammetry aimed at managing geographical and territorial information.

In recent years it has dedicated itself with particular interest to interdisciplinary aspects of archaeological research, collaborating with research institutes in other disciplinary sectors (geology and computer engineering) whose results, the result of innovative research projects rewarded and

funded by the MIUR and by its own University, have found an edition in conference proceedings, scientific articles and journals and books edited by her. She has participated since 2000 in the research activities of the Aerofotogrammetria Laboratory for Cultural Heritage of the Faculty of Letters and Philosophy - Second University of Naples, today Aereo-topographic application sector of the Ancient Topography Laboratory of the University of Campania "L. Vanvitelli ", which has been coordinating since 2007, overseeing the updating and realization of finalized aerial photogrammetries of Italic settlements, ancient cities and road of Campania, Lazio and Abruzzo.

For several years she has been carrying out survey activities for the development of preventive archeology maps and the drafting of the Archaeological Map of northern Campania directed by prof. Stefania Quilici Gigli, published in the supplement XV of the Thematic Topography of Ancient Topography with publications on specific areas territorial and thematic luges: it is dedicated, in particular, to the caudino territory close to the plain of Campania (work published in 2006 in the supplement XV, 3), to that of the Partenio chain facing the Nola and Abbellano agro (2012 supplement XV, 7; 2016 suppl. XV, 9), to that of the Tifata chain in the municipality of Bellona (2014 suppl. XV, 8), to that of the Irpinia territory in the municipality of Savignano Irpino (2016 suppl. XV, 9), to that of the internal Campania region in the municipalities of Melizzano and Frasso Telesino (2017 suppl. XV, 10).

In addition to the publications of the Archaeological Map already mentioned, she has published numerous publications, on ancient cities (Abellinum (AV), Norba (LT)), analysis of monuments (via Appia; fortified settlements in the caudina area; mausoleums of the agro nola) and groups of archaeological finds (Valle del Sinni and Norba) (research published in journals of category A). She has continuously participated in research projects coordinated by the C.N.R.-Ministry of Cultural Heritage, in research programs PRIN and PRIST. From 2010 to 2017 she was the scientific coordinator of the local unit of the FIRB project - Protocol RBFR10DKZK_002, The landscape of a great Roman road. Model of multidisciplinary approach for a diachronic reconstruction applied to the Appian Way to the pass of Aurunci, approved and financed, national scientific manager E. Di Luzio.

In terms of teaching at the University of Campania "Luigi Vanvitelli" she has been continuously covering since the 2008/2009 academic year of the disciplinary sector L_ANT / 09, the Aerotopografia teachings: archaeological photointerpretation; Archaeological aerotopography: finalized photogrammetry and remote sensing, Survey and Analysis of ancient monuments: general features and Survey and Technical Analysis of Ancient Monuments, coordinating research groups and curricular training and graduation thesis activities. For the same Department he has held, for the academic years from 2008/2009 to 2015/2016, the teaching of Archaeological research methodology within the disciplinary sector L_ANT / 10.

For the same University, within the Department of Political Sciences from the Academic Year 2018-2019, he teaches Analysis of the historical values of the territory, within the disciplinary sector L_ANT / 09, for the Three-year Degree Course in Sciences of Tourism. She is professor on "Rilievo e Analisi Tecnica dei Monumenti Antichi" for the Scuola di Specializzazione in Archeologia – Suor Orsola Benincasa-Univeristà della Campania L. Vanvitelli.

Since 2013 at 2018 she was a member of the faculty of the Graduate School in "Architettura, disegno industriale e Beni Culturali" at the University of Campania "Luigi Vanvitelli".

Since 2019 she is a member of the faculty of the Graduate School in Archaeology (Ancient Topography curriculum) at the University of Rome "La Sapienza".

Since 2013 - Qualification of Second Level Professor. She has seventy publications to his credit, among books, chapters of books and articles, national and international, published in large part in magazines of type A, and is volumes curator (see publications).
