

## CURRICULUM VITAE (english)

Daniele Solvi (Rome, 1971) is aggregate professor of Medieval and Humanistic Latin Literature at the Università della Campania "Luigi Vanvitelli" (Italy) and board member of AISSCA (Associazione Italiana per lo Studio della Santità, dei Culti e dell'Agiografia, Rome) and SISF (Società Internazionale di Studi Francescani, Assisi). His most important research fields include philological, literary and historical investigations about religious texts of the Late Middle Ages, narratological analysis of both literary and not literary medieval latin works, history of medieval studies, and informatic applications for humanities. He wrote studies mostly on the works and medieval lives of Francis of Assisi and Bernardino of Siena, the franciscan hagiography and historiography from XIII to XV century, and other religious late-medieval texts of several genres (theology, mystic, inquisition, sermons, prophecy and eschatology). Among his main publications are the critical edition of the *Speculum perfectionis status fratris Minoris* (Florence 2006), the 5 vols. of *La letteratura francescana* (with Claudio Leonardi and Francesco Santi, Milan 2004-2015; a sixth volume on the Spirituals is in preparation), and *Le vite quattrocentesche di Bernardino da Siena. II. L'agiografia su Bernardino santo (1450-1460)* (Florence 2014).
