

Lorenza Magliano, MD, PhD, is Associate Professor of Psychiatry at the Campania University of Caserta, Italy. She has an extensive experience of research in family burden, coping strategies and social network in severe mental disorders and long-term physical diseases, in stigma against people with mental disorders, and in evidence-based psychosocial interventions.

In the field of the psycho-social interventions, she has contributed to adapting Falloon's Family Psychoeducational Intervention (FPI) to Italian socio-cultural context and implementing FPI in routine settings, in Italy and internationally. She has co-developed a Manual for planning and assessing individualized rehabilitative intervention, and she developed several tools for routine assessment of family burden, social network and coping strategies as well as of stigma in health contexts. She also developed and tested an educational intervention to reduce stigma against people with schizophrenia among health disciplines students. Furthermore, she developed a Combined Individual and Group rehabilitative Intervention (CIGI) to be used in psychiatric residencies and semi-residential settings, testing its effectiveness. She also wrote a Manual for CIGI implementation in routine settings and for peer-to-peer staff training procedures. She contributed to Italian translation of the WHO Manual "Thinking healthy: a manual for psychosocial management of perinatal depression".

She has been involved in international and national studies on the implementation of evidence-based psychosocial interventions for people with schizophrenia and major depression in routine clinical settings, in study on stigma against people with mental disorders among school and university students, lay people, health professionals, employees and priests. She is currently exploring positive changes in mental health services due to pandemic.

From 1992 to 1998, she has been temporary researcher at the Laboratory of Epidemiology and Biostatistics of the National Institute of Health, Rome, Italy, mainly working in project on Quality Assurance in MH Care, Mental Health Services Evaluation, and on Implementation of Evidence-based psychosocial interventions in Italian Mental Health Services. From 2000 to 2008, she has been alternate member on behalf the Department of Psychiatry, University of Campania "Luigi Vanvitelli" (former name: Second University of Naples) at the WHO-Europe working group on stigma. In 2010, she has been temporary advisor of WHO-Europe working group on Empowerment of persons with mental disorders in 2010 and contributed in the development of the User empowerment in mental health – a statement by the WHO Regional Office for Europe. From 2012 to 2014, she has been Member of the Scientific Committee of the project on the Assessment of persons in Italian Forensic Hospitals, coordinated by the National Health Institute, Italy. From 2015 to date she is working on the implementation of Combined Individual and Group rehabilitative Intervention for people with severe mental disorders in residential and semi-residential facilities, in projects on stigma against people with mental disorders in health and social contexts and in Telethon's projects on burden in families of children with muscular dystrophies and in patients with hereditary transthyretin amyloidosis (ATTRv).

From 1998 to 2009, she has been Head of the Research Laboratory of Social Psychiatry, Department of Psychiatry, Faculty of Medicine, SUN. Since 2012, she is Head of the Research Laboratory of Epidemiology and Social Psychiatry and, since 2021, she is Head of the Research Group on Social Determinants of Health, Department of Psychology, University of Campania "Luigi Vanvitelli", Italy. She has published more than 80 papers in indexed international journals with impact factor, and she is co-author of a manual on psychosocial rehabilitation, and author of the Manual on Combined Individual and Group rehabilitative Intervention (CIGI). She is reviewer for many international journals.

Since 2021, she is the Chair of the Master's degree in Applied Psychology, Department of Psychology, University of Campania "Luigi Vanvitelli", Caserta, Italy.
