Born in Naples in 1963, she graduated in Literature in 1986 (110/110 cum laude) at the University of Naples Federico II. In 1991 she obtained the Diploma of Specialization in History of Art (70/70 cum laude) at the same University.

After a scientific collaboration contract with the History Department of the University of Calabria, in 1995 she received the Ph.D. degree (7th cycle) in historical disciplines of medieval, modern and contemporary art: History and criticism of the figurative arts in Southern Italy. In 1996 she obtained the Diploma in Archival and Palaeography at the State Archives of Naples.

She won a post-doctoral scholarship at the University of Naples Federico II (1997-1999) and then a research grant for the project entitled "Museo Campano" (tutor prof. From 2000 to 2006 she was a University Researcher (confirmed in the position starting from 31.12.2003) for the disciplinary sector LART / 04 at the Second University of Naples.

In 2006 she was eligible for tenure promotion as associate professor in the scientific disciplinary sector LART04 Museology and artistic criticism and restoration at the Faculty of Design and Art of the IUAV University of Venice.

Since 2007 she is Associate Professor, LART04 scientific disciplinary sector Museology and artistic criticism and restoration at the Faculty of Letters and Philosophy of SUN (now Department of Letters and Cultural Heritage of the University of Campania "Luigi Vanvitelli").

She was confirmed in the role in 2011.

In 2014 she obtained the qualification as full professor with unanimous evaluation.

Starting from 1997-1998 and until the academic year 2018-2019, for the "Course in Conservation of Cultural Heritage" Degree, the three-year Degree "Courses in Letters and Cultural Heritage", for the "Specialized Degree Course" (later Magistrale), in History of Art and subsequently for the Master's Degree Course in Archeology and History of Art, she held:

Most of those activities were attended by some of the most prominent scholars of the discipline, at national and international level.

# SCIENTIFIC PROFILE AND MAIN RESEARCH LINES

Nadia Barrella has been involved in the "History of protection and nineteenth and twentieth century Museology", focusing in particular on the situation in southern Italy, unifying intentions of historical reconstruction with a cognitive activity, aimed to design and propose intervention in the museum field.

Most of her titles belong to the historical trend, centred on problems related to the evolution of the museum structure in relation to its cultural project; to the history of collecting and the protection of monuments.

Her study activity aimed to focus on the problems of the history of the museum, collectibles and guardianship, analysing the progressive refinement of the historical awareness of the art and the technical-scientific capacities of the conservation protagonists.

This activity was constantly accompanied by a reflection on the contemporary museum in national and international contexts and the analysis of aspects relating to its management, museum education and communication also through the use of new technologies.

### 1. Activity and coordination of research groups

# 2010 - today

She directs the research activity of the Campania Museums Observatory, coordinating undergraduates, graduate students and a research fellow (the grant was funded at the Department of Letters and Cultural Heritage with private funds for the academic year 2018-2019).

The Observatory carries out its activity through a special database that contains information on the Campania museums, organized on the basis of the *eight areas of the Museum Standards* foreseen by the D.M. May 10, 2001.

The database is constantly updated and is the starting point of the research paths of the chair of Museology.

The Observatory has carried out, through the doctoral students, studies on the communication of the museums, on the history of the protection, on the eco-museum structures and on the activity of the palace of Caserta.

The Observatory is currently reorganizing the database to assess the new uniform quality levels of the museums of Campania (LUQM Ministerial Decree n.113 dated 02.21.2018) for the purposes of joining the new National Museum System. The institute has benefited from regional contributions to support interventions and activities aimed at developing, promoting and enhancing the museums of local and local interest and an annual scholarship for 2016/2017.

In 2014, Campania region funded the projects "For the diffusion of the service card at Campania's Local Government Museums" and, in 2018, the Project entitled "Quality Uniform Levels for Campania's Local Museums". Staff training and refresher courses: regulation and periodic reports. Employees and volunteers from 30 museums in Campania participated in both courses, with very important repercussions for updating staff and providing services to the public.

### **Since 2014**

She is the coordinator of the Departmental research group "The cultural heritage for sustainable development and social integration".

The group develops paths of knowledge, conservation and social and economic enhancement of artistic, architectural and landscape assets, within urban and territorial areas illustrative of the wider regional territorial structure reading them as models for interventions able to involve, as primary subjects of promotion and fruition of cultural assets, social groups and local productive realities, favouring connections with the most updated experiences at national and European level in terms of sustainable development, communication, social inclusion, integration.

Within this framework and with this common goal, the group has followed - in the four-years period 2014-2018 - research paths also linked to the features of its members (professors and researchers of museology, art criticism, history of contemporary art, history of the city) and related to museums, communication, art history and criticism, public art, sustainable development.

The study of museums, as part of this research activity, has a mainly international vocation (European management standards, ICTOP for strategies related to staff training, urban centres and eco-museums for attention to the territory and its story) and enjoys the relations of the scholar with ICOM Italy and ICOM International. Coordination is underway with the MUZA of Malta for study paths related to the theme Participatory Museum / Community Museum.

### **Since 2017**

- She is a member of a national inter-universities research group conducting researches on the activities of the Franceschini Commission (1964-1967) and on the relationship between the national debate and international choices on the protection of cultural heritage in the 1960s (Coordinator of the group: Roberto Balzani, Professor of Contemporary History University of Bologna. The results of the research will be published by "Il Mulino" with contributions from the IBC Emilia Romagna)

Through a multidisciplinary and multimodal approach, the group will analyse the characteristics of the messages produced by the official accounts of the most popular museums on the main social networks and will evaluate, even if at random, the perception and reception of followers.
